Lessons for Future Fellows: Fellowship Endgame

- Leave Your Refuge with the Ability to Continue
 - Limited time on Refuge—10 months
- Ask yourself:
 - Who will take on the responsibility
 - How will they be able too
 - What resources can be created to help
 - How best to ingrate transportation projects into the Refuge
- Close Out Examples:
 - Project one sheet
 - Transportation Handbook
 - Database of projects
 - Future transportation capacity and technical assistance

Transportation Projects: Refuge Only

Project: Downriver Linked Greenways—Gibraltar Trail segment maintenance

Project Scope: The trail of the Gibraltar segment of the Downriver Linked Greenways, that runs parallel to the Humbug Marsh Unit, has cracks forming on outer edge of trial and in clusters groups on the trail. To extend the life of the trail and prevent much more expensive repairs in the future, the cracks need to be treated with sealant.

Project Area: Humbug Marsh Unit

Leading/Owner Organization(s): FWS -DRIWR

Related Organizations: City of Gibraltar; City of Trenton

Shared path maintenance agreement

Referenced Documents

Path Maintenance Agreement_renewal_2018

Past Work Completed:

A small segment received past sealant treatment from possible tree root damage

Current Status of Project:

Surveying of entire trail to estimate amount of sealant needed

Next Steps:

- Reach out to contractors for price estimates for project
- Before treatment, cracks need to have debris blown out of them

Considerations or Comments:

- Temperature needs to be above 40 °F for treatment
- Path maintenance agreement with the City of Trenton segment of trail needs to be renewed before March 2019

 - Transportation plans/reports
 - Master plans
 - Recreation plans
 - Historical documents
 - Past PLTF/S past reports
- Browse Refuge's sharedrive

- Subscribe to:
 - Regional and local news feeds
 - Federal funding opportunities
 - Other federal, state,
 transportation and
 conservation agencies











Hit the Ground Running (count.)

- Dial in
 - Local, city and regional transportation groups
- Introductory conversation with partners, communities and stakeholders
- See the refuge! Explore with Staff and see their work
- Utilized the transportation network
 - Bike, kayak, walk, ride the bus, etc.











General Suggestions

- Utilize your mentor and WTI resources
- Make lists
- Go to regional and local meetings
- Use that professional development, and tie it back to the work your are doing
- Don't be intimated by lack of local knowledge
- Take pictures and start your final report
- Enjoy your time
