2020 Public Lands Transportation Fellows Program Requirements

Applicants to the Public Lands Transportation Fellows program must:

- Be U.S. citizens, nationals, or lawful permanent resident aliens of the U.S.;
- Be 30 years of age or under by the start date; and
- Have at least a bachelor's degree; however, the preference is for recent or soon-to-be master's degree graduates.

Selected transportation fellows must be available for the pre-project orientation the week of July 13-17, 2020 in the Washington D.C. area

2020 Application Process

For applications to be eligible, the following items **MUST** be received:

- ✓ Employment application
- ✓ Resume
- ✓ Candidate statement that addresses the following in 1000 words or less:
 - interest in contributing to the Federal Lands
 - ability to adapt to new situations and people
 - relevant experience / knowledge / skills
 - preferred assignment(s)
- ✓ Writing and/or graphics communication sample
 - Writing sample – the purpose of this submittal is to show us your technical writing skills.
 - Graphics communication sample - the purpose of this submittal is to show us your GIS skills, graphical skills, and/or marketing skills.
- ✓ Letter of recommendation from a current or past supervisor, academic advisor, or other person who can attest to your knowledge, skills, and character. (Letter can be sent directly to Jaime Sullivan at Jaime.sullivan2@montana.edu)

2020 Public Lands Transportation Fellows Program Assignments

A total of 5 positions are available. Two (2) at US Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) location and three (3) National Park Service (NPS) locations. Locations include:

1. Southeast Louisiana Refuge Complex, Lacombe, LA,
2. Eastern Massachusetts National Wildlife Refuge Complex, Sudbury, MA.
3. Rotate through the National Park Service (NPS) Headquarters office, a NPS regional office (exact location TBD), and a NPS unit (exact location TBD)
