Pat McMahon currently serves as the Climate Change Adaptation and Active Transportation Fellow for the National Parks Service (NPS). Pat graduated in 2019 from The Ohio State University with a bachelor's degree in Geography and minor studies in Urban and Regional Planning and Environmental Science. He is currently pursuing a Master of Science in Land Resources and Environmental Science at Montana State University. Academically, Pat is primarily interested in understanding the impacts of climate change on infrastructure and natural resources, and strategies for adapting to climatic and environmental changes.

Pat's 2020-2022 Fellowship with the NPS had two primary focuses. The first is supporting the NPS Transportation Planning Program on developing climate change adaptation and resilience strategies in Washington State, especially at North Cascades National Park. The
